Governor Vetoes Bill to Make It Easier and Cheaper to Discriminate; In the Meantime, Bill to Protect Gun-Owners from Discrimination Passes House

n March 8 the Missouri Senate voted 23-8 to grant final passage to House Bill 1219 that would make it easier and less expensive for employers to escape legal responsibility for engaging in workplace discrimination. The vote was along straight party lines with Republicans in support and Democrats opposed. Because the House of Representatives had already passed the bill last month, HB 1219 then moved to the desk of Gov. Jay Nixon, who had vetoed similar legislation last year.

Gov. Nixon again stood firm, vetoing the bill on March 16. In doing so, he said: "House Bill 1219 is nearly identical to a bill I vetoed last year because it would undermine the Missouri Human Rights Act and decades of progress on civil rights. This bill contains those same fundamental flaws. Rather than making it easier to discriminate

against people with disabilities or cancer, or against women, older workers and minorities, we need to keep our focus on the economic policies that are moving us forward, such as the Missouri Works initiative."

HB 1219 would substantially raise the legal bar for bringing claims of unlawful workplace discrimination based on race, gender, age, disability or religion. For cases that still manage to make to court, the bill would severely limit the amount of damages victims could recover. Weakening Missouri's workplace discrimination laws is a top priority for the Missouri Chamber of Commerce and Industry and other groups that purport to represent major businesses. (I still do not believe this legislation matches the wishes of the majority of Missouri employers.)

Also on March 16, Gov. Nixon vetoed a change to workers' compensation laws in Senate Bill 572. Gov. Nixon said, "We also should not take a step back in protecting workers who are afflicted with serious or deadly diseases, as a result of their workplaces. Unfortunately, this bill weakens the important workplace protections that are part of our laws and regulations....This bill moves us backward on protecting Missouri's productive workers."

All members of the Missouri House and Senate from St. Louis City have vowed to stand behind the governor's veto of both bills. The Majority Party is likely to only call a vote to overturn the veto if at least four members of the Minority Party can be convinced to support the override.

In what can only be called News of the Weird: On the same day that the General Assembly endorsed making it easier to discriminate based on race, gender, age, disability or religion, the House voted 188-37 in favor of a separate bill that would make concealed gun permit holders a protected class against whom workplace discrimination would be illegal. The sponsor, Rep. Wanda Brown (R-Lincoln) had no compelling evidence that such discrimination is occurring in Missouri but wished to fire a preemptive strike just in case. That bill, HB 1621, now goes to the Senate. Hopefully some of my Senate colleagues will take their vitamins and a big cup of coffee and prepare to filibuster this totally needless bill if that's what it takes to kill it.





years we sadly divorced, I went back to school and got my degree in what was called Data Processing, the age of computers was just dawning (I had a Commodore 64).

I moved to St. Louis and worked at the Special School District for about five years and then went to my present job at Safety National Casualty, an excess workers compensation insurance carrier in Westport Plaza, where I have been for almost 23 years.





"The New World" will be performed April 27-29 at the intersection of Cherokee Avenue and California Street in the Gravois Park Neighborhood, right on the border of Benton Park West.

Of the cast of 19 actors, only three are professionals. The rest are amateurs, most of whom live in the neighborhood. They lend authenticity to a play intended to reflect Cherokee Street with its varied ethnic groups and one-of-kind shops.

The play is very loosely based on William Shakespeare's "The Tempest," which is set on a remote island dominated by magic. Cherokee

street will be brought into the production as actors will refer to different Cherokee Street landmarks and familiar points.

Board

In "The New World," the main characters are Pros-

pero, an exiled duke, and his daughter, Miranda. Antonio is the duke's brother who usurped his power 12 years earlier. Since that time, Prospero and Miranda have lived on an island with their spirit helper, Ariel, and a library of books of magic. They are the source of Prospero's power. A shipwreck lands Antonio's son, Ferdinand, on the same island and he ends up falling in love with Miranda. It is Prospero's fortune to right relationships with everyone on this island.

Shakespeare Festival St. Louis is presenting "The New World" with the assistance of PNC Arts Alive and the National Endowment of the Arts.

The word "bard" is an ancient Gaelic term meaning "poet." In medieval England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales, bards were traveling poets who performed stories in exchange for money. Shakespeare is called The Bard because he is considered the greatest poet the world has ever known.
